

Comparison of Nebraska With Other Midwest Region States

In 2014, of the nine Midwest states reporting, Iowa and Wisconsin registered the highest with a total case incidence rate for the private sector of 3.9 cases per 100 full-time employees. Illinois recorded the lowest numbers with 2.8 cases.

Incidence rates by major industry division varied greatly between states. In manufacturing, the total case incidence rate ranged from 6.3 in Nebraska to 4.0 in Illinois. In the construction industry, the most hazardous of the major industry divisions, incidence rates ranged from 5.5 in Wisconsin to 2.4 in Illinois.

Data was not available for North Dakota and South Dakota.

Note on industry and occupation classifications: Beginning with the 2009 reference year, the Survey of Occupational Injuries and Illnesses (SOII) began using the 2007 North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). During reference years 2003 through 2008, the SOII program used the 2002 NAICS for industries and the Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) system for occupations. Prior to 2003, the program used the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) system and the Bureau of the Census occupational classification system. Because of the substantial differences between the current and previous systems, the results by

industry and occupation in 2003 constituted a break in series, and users are advised against making comparisons between the 2003 industry and occupation categories and the results of previous years. All employees in these industries (e.g., part-time, full-time, casual, etc.) are covered in this survey. Excluded are self-employed individuals.

In addition, all agricultural production employers (NAICS 110000-115310) with 10 or fewer employees are excluded. The Federal Mine Safety and Health Administration provided data conforming to OSHA definitions for employers covered by the Federal Mine Safety and Health Act of 1977. The Federal Railroad Administration furnished data for any railroads.

The original survey sample consisted of 4,008 units. A portion of these were excluded because they were no longer in operation, were not within the scope of the survey, were included in the report for another location, received duplicate survey forms for the same location or the survey form was not mailable because of an inadequate address. When these exclusions were taken into account, the number of potential respondents was reduced to 3,640. Follow-up mailings and telephone calls to non-respondents resulted in 3,281 usable questionnaires, or a 88 percent response rate.

Survey Questionnaire

The survey questionnaire requested information concerning average employment during the calendar year 2014; total employee hours worked during 2014; the number of occupational injuries and illnesses by type (i.e., fatalities, lost workday cases, cases without lost workdays, and information on all lost workday cases). Under Federal grant arrangements, the respondent fills out a single reporting form which is used for developing both national and state estimates.

Occupational Safety and Health Definitions

OSHA Injury and Illness Recordkeeping and Reporting Requirements

Under the OSHA Recordkeeping regulation (29 CFR 1904), *covered* employers are required to prepare and maintain records of serious occupational injuries and illnesses, using the OSHA 300 Log. This information is important for employers, workers, and OSHA in evaluating the safety of a workplace, understanding industry hazards, and implementing worker protections to reduce and eliminate hazards. OSHA is responsible for the administration and interpretation of issues related to recordkeeping and safety standards. Below is a link to the requirements.

How to Compute a Firm's Incidence Rate for Safety Management

Incidence rates can be used to show the relative level of injuries and illnesses among different industries, firms, or operations within a single firm. Because a common base and a specific period of time are involved, these rates can help determine both problem areas and progress in preventing work-related injuries and illnesses. The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) has developed instructions, which may be accessed at the link below, to provide a step-by-step approach for employers to evaluate their firm's injury and illness record.
